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More Than \$82 Million Awarded for Arts Projects Nationwide


Includes \$30,000 awarded to Conspirare for multi-state tour

Austin, TX—National Endowment for the Arts Chairman Jane Chu has approved more than \$82 million to fund local arts projects across the country in the NEA’s second major funding announcement for fiscal year 2017. Included in this announcement is an Art Works award of \$30,000 to Conspirare to support the February 2018 multi-state tour of *Considering Matthew Shepard*. The NEA received 1,728 Art Works applications and will make 1,029 grants ranging from \$10,000 to \$100,000.

“The arts reflect the vision, energy, and talent of America’s artists and arts organizations,” said NEA Chairman Jane Chu. “The National Endowment for the Arts is proud to support organizations such as Conspirare, in serving their communities by providing excellent and accessible arts experiences.”

Artistic Director Craig Hella Johnson said, “We are grateful for the continued support of the NEA. Their support has allowed Conspirare to achieve a national presence through touring and recording world-class choral music. The NEA’s ongoing support of *Considering Matthew Shepard* is especially meaningful as this work is resonating with so many Americans.”

Since 2012, the NEA has provided \$135,000 in support of Conspirare’s programs, including the 2016 recording and 2015 performances of *Considering Matthew Shepard*. Led from the piano by Johnson, *Considering Matthew Shepard* showcases the award-winning artistry of Conspirare’s singers with a chamber ensemble of renowned instrumentalists. This three-part fusion oratorio is set to a wide range of poetic and soulful texts by poets including Hildegard of Bingen, Lesléa Newman, Michael Dennis Browne, and Rumi. Passages from Matt’s personal journal, interviews and writings from his parents, newspaper reports and additional texts by Johnson and Browne are poignantly appointed throughout the work.
